The turf, as we begin the melt down, is extremely vulnerable to damage right now. While the surfaces may appear ready for activity, the soil beneath is extremely wet.

The freeze - thaw periods that will be the common theme over the next few weeks will slowly trend above freezing temperatures, allowing the soil to dry out.



Obviously we are not out of the woods with winter storms just yet. but it looks like the extended brutally cold temperatures are behind us.


